Essential sewer renovation in Litton Cheney

We're repairing sewers in **Litton Cheney** after our recent investigations identified a number of faults within the network.

Relining and sealing sewers in this way helps protect the environment, preventing foul water escaping and groundwater entering sewers, which can lead to flooding or storm overflows automatically discharging into rivers or the sea if the system becomes overwhelmed.

This work, an investment of £200,000, will start in mid-June and is expected to last for six weeks.

How will the work affect you?

The work will be carried out using 'no-dig' techniques, which are quicker and less intrusive than replacing the pipe in a conventional manner.

- **Monday 22 – Wednesday 24 June** – A road closure will be in place on **Litton Lane**, from outside **3 Whitecross** to the junction with **Cox's Lane**. A signposted diversion route via **Hines Mead Lane** and **Dorchester Road (A35)** entering Litton Cheney via **Long Bredy Lane** will be in place.
- **Wednesday 24 – Friday 26 June** – A rolling road closure will be in place on **Hines Mead Lane**, starting at the junction with **Baglake** rolling down to outside **4 Matters Cottages**. A signposted diversion, using **Cox's Lane** and **Main Street** will be in place.
- **Monday 29 – Tuesday 30 June** – A road closure will be in place on **Chalk Pit Lane**, from the junction with **Main Street** going to the junction with **Litton Hill**. A signposted diversion route will be in place, via **Hines Mead Lane** and **Dorchester Road (A35)** entering Litton Cheney via **Long Bredy Lane**.

Wednesday 29 – Friday 31 July – A road closure will be in place on **Main Street** from the junction with **School Lane** to outside **The Cheese House**. The diversion route will via **Chalk Pit Lane**, **Hines Mead Lane** and **Cox's Lane**
